Sport at school is predominantly organised by the two members of the Sports Office, teachers and the wider community. Each major code has a 'Person in Charge' who oversees the running of the code, coaches and managers etc.

Dan Meade came on board as Director of Sport at the start of 2020. Mr Meade is an avid sports fan, having played rugby, rowing, touch, surf club and social beach volleyball over the years. He started his career in education at Hamilton Boys' High School where he taught Physical Education and ran the Outdoor Education department. He enjoys coaching as well as the strength and conditioning side of sport.

Sports Administrator, Loren Riddall, has had a long affiliation with Mount Maunganui College, first getting involved with sport when her children were playing for the school. Loren's organisation and aroha for the students did not go unnoticed and she was first brought on in 2017. Loren has a wealth of knowledge in sports administration and is currently on the board for Volleyball Bay of Plenty.

The role of a PIC is to oversee the code and support the coaches and managers within that code. PICs work with the Sport Department to achieve the goals as set out above.

Sports Performance Programme

Football

Rugby

The Mount Maunganui College Rugby Academy was established in 2019 with the goal of improving the development and success of rugby teams and talent.

Due to the hard work and commitment from staff involved the rugby programme has grown to become the third biggest in the Bay of Plenty with six teams. This dedication has also seen the First XV promoted to Division 1 in 2020 for the first time since 2015. MMC was also nominated for Coach of the Year in 2019 at the BOP Rugby Union Awards and took out Rugby School of the Year. The girls game is continuing to grow and in 2020 both the U16 and U18 girls teams competing to high level with the U16 team making it to the final of their competition.

Due to a number of other initiatives and the generous support from Moon Civil and Drainage the programme is set to continue to grow in accolades and numbers across both the girls and boys game over the coming years.
